- Recognize <u>origins</u> of foods, recipes, ingredients, utensils being used at the physical food hub
- Freezer space for country foods
- Availability of various <u>utensils</u>, <u>spices</u>, <u>ingredients</u>
- Availability of information regarding where to shop for specific cultural/religious/geographical foods in Kelowna

Recommendations: Next Steps

- 1. The formation of a <u>multi-stakeholder committee</u> for the planning and development of a physical food hub at UBCO. The committee is to include students, staff, and faculty.
- 2. Committee to <u>determine high-level governance</u> structure
 - a. Associate Vice President Students portfolio
 - b. Staffing is essential
 - c. Physical space and funding
- 3. The <u>development and construction</u> of the physical food hub must be prioritized (indoor and outdoor components)
