Supporting food security at UBCO

As reported by the 2019 UBCO **Undergraduate Experience Survey:**

42% OF STUDENTS EXPERIENCE HOUSEHOLD FOOD INSECURITY

Household Food Insecurity indicates the lack of sufficient quantity of nutritiously adequate food due to low <u>income</u>.

- A cross-Canada environmental scan of 25 food security <u>initiatives</u>
- <u>22 consultation sessions</u> with 109 UBCO staff, faculty, and students

- 3) University administration and planning must **prioritize construction** of the physical food hub. They must allocate outdoor space to the physical food hub.
