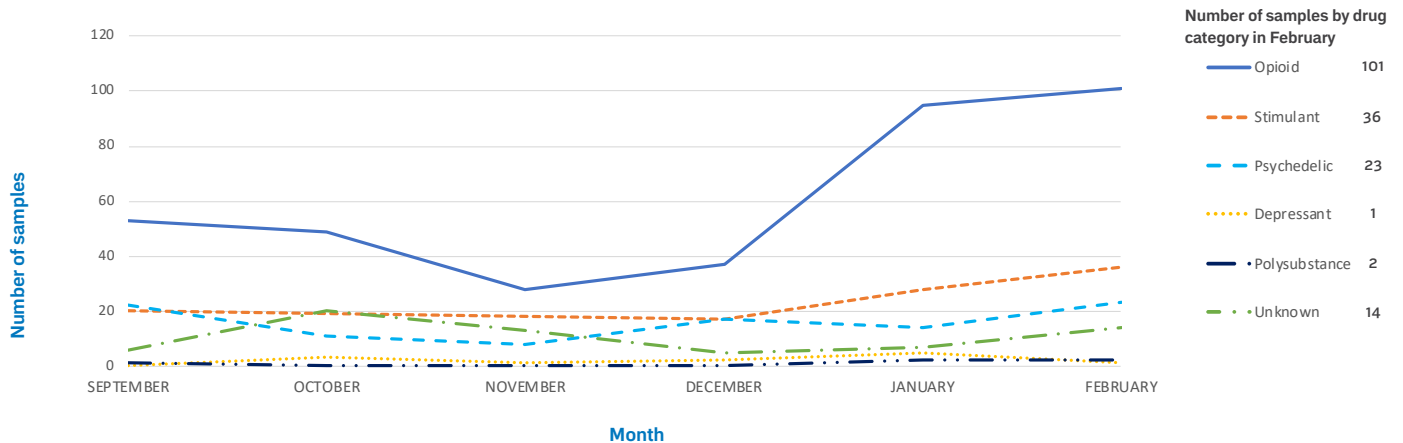


Key Findings

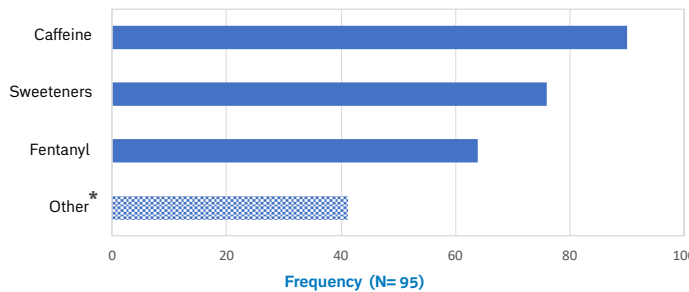
- The number of samples tested (176) has continued to increase this month. The increase is due to the addition of a new and growing service with the Harm Reduction Team (HaRT) at UBCO.
- The percentage of opioids testing positive for benzodiazepines in the Interior Health region (36%) has remained consistent from last month but has been on upward trend since September (6%).
- There were 8 drug checking alerts in Interior Health for this month highlighting drugs adulterated with benzodiazepines.

Number of drug samples checked in the past 6 months

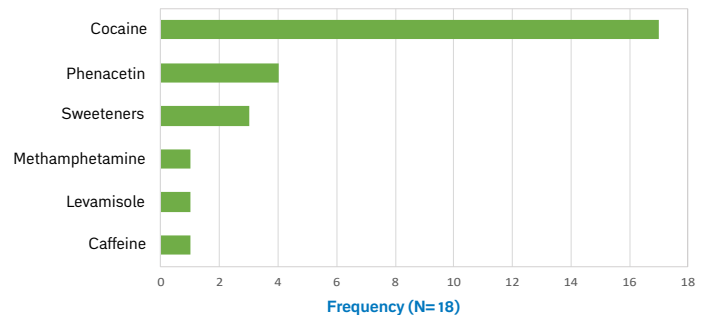


Components found in drug samples in February

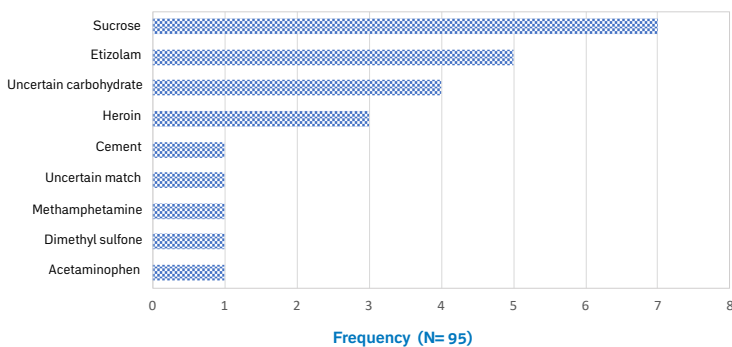
Components in opioids



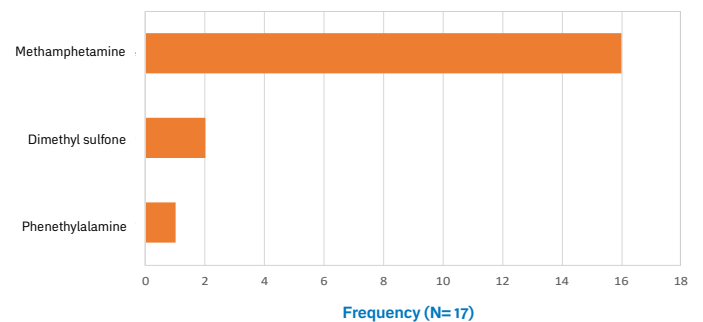
Components in cocaine



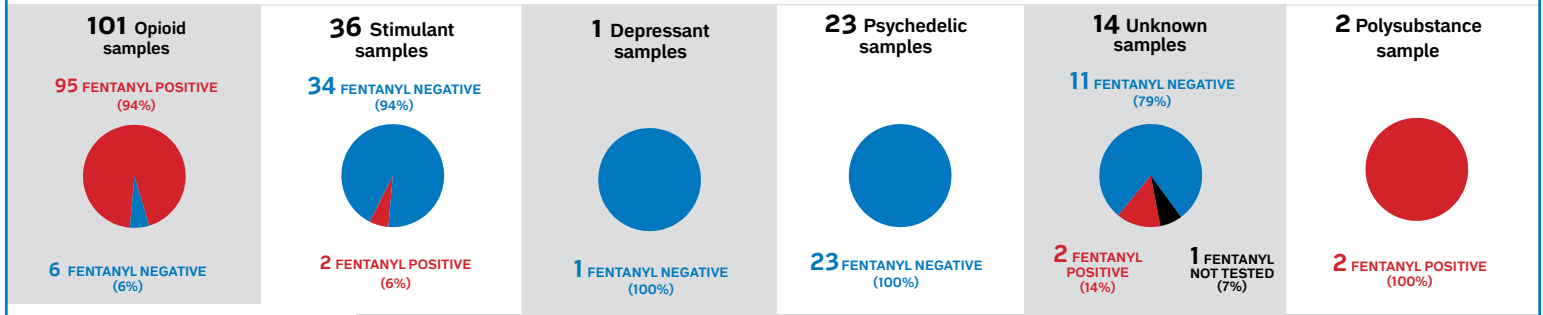
* Other components found in opioids

Number of samples tested with fentanyl present

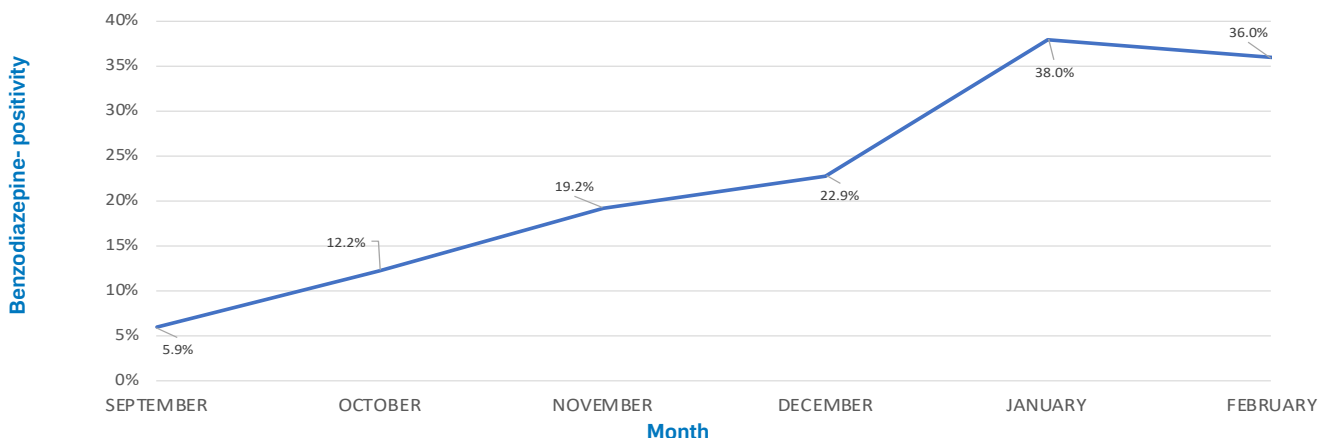

5 February 2021- ANKORS, Cranbrook	Down	Contains benzodiazepines and high concentrations of fentanyl	Positive	Positive	Cranbrook	High risk of prolonged sedation and overdose-Check your drugs for benzodiazepines at any local SCS/OPS.
5 February 2021- ANKORS, Cranbrook	Down	High fentanyl concentration and benzodiazepines	Positive	Positive	Cranbrook	May not respond to naloxone- continue to give breaths and seek medical attention.
5 February 2021- ASK Wellness, Kamloops	Cocaine	Methamphetamine, cocaine, levamisole	N/A	N/A	Kamloops	Meth is a powerful stimulant that has longer lasting effects than cocaine. Check your drugs for unexpected substances!
4 February 2021- UBCO Kelowna/West Kelowna	Fentanyl	Benzodiazepines and fentanyl	Positive	Positive	Kelowna	High risk of overdose with prolonged sedation-may not respond to Naloxone. Use at an OPS!
3 February 2021- ANKORS, Castlegar	Fentanyl	Fentanyl and benzodiazepines	Positive	Positive	Castlegar	Check for benzos in your drugs at any SCS or OPS!
2 February 2021- IHA Penticton	Down	High concentration of fentanyl and benzodiazepines	Positive	Positive	Penticton	High risk of overdose with prolonged sedation

During the month of February, **36%** of expected opioid samples tested positive for benzodiazepines using test strips in our partner sites in the Interior Health region (**36 samples of 100 tested**).







Opioid samples are tested for benzodiazepine-positivity using BTNX test strips. The results presented above are presumptive and tentative until confirmed by a laboratory.

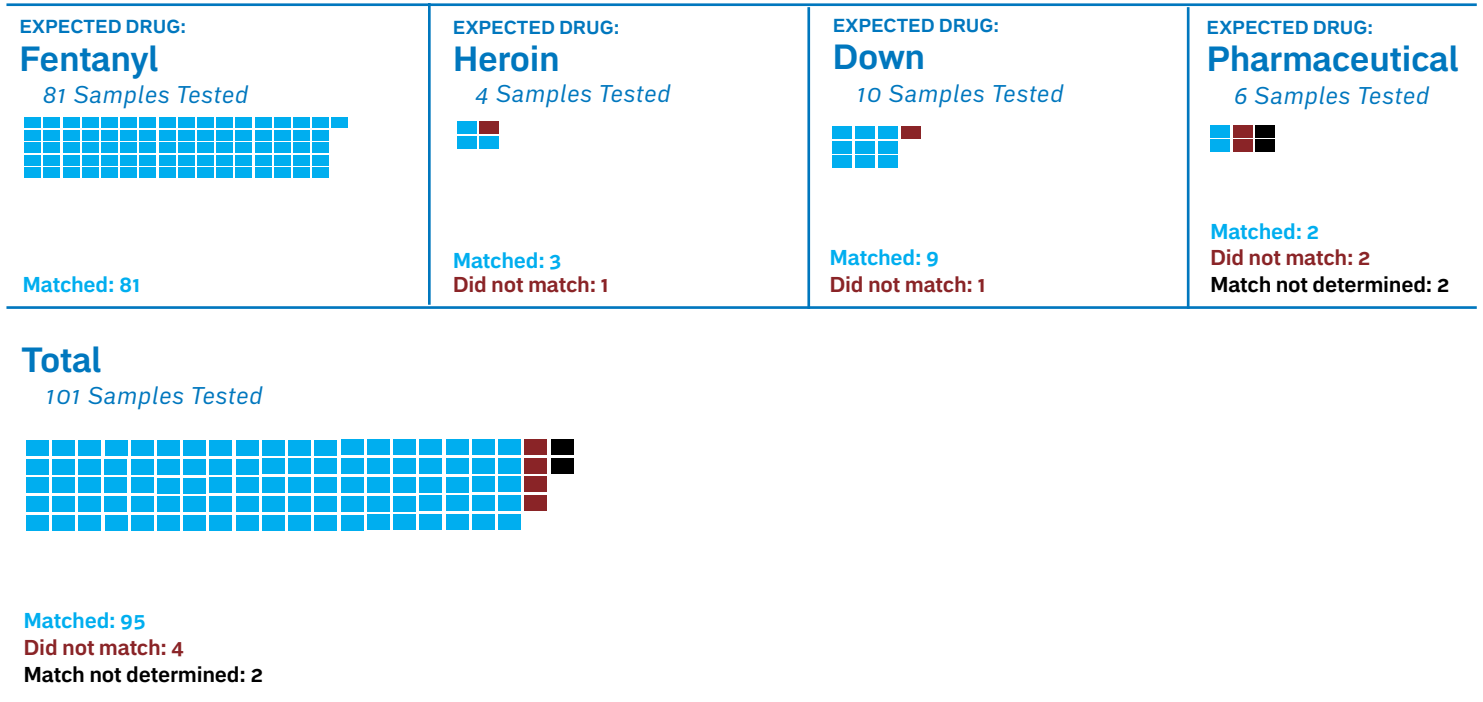

Please note that the presence of the expected substance does not imply purity, as samples frequently contain adulterating cutting agents. 'Down' can refer to any opioid drug present in any amount.

Data represented here are collected from our partner sites across the province. Drug samples are tested using the Fourier Transform Infrared (FTIR) spectrometer in combination with fentanyl test strips and benzodiazepine test strips.

There is 5% fentanyl detection limit on the FTIR spectrometer (McCrae, 2019), and a drug check on any given sample consists of both the FTIR and BTNX fentanyl immunoassay test strip testing done in combination. When applicable, BTNX benzodiazepine immunoassay test strips are also used.
